It was successful but more important, it shows FSD our strength and solidarity.

Speaking of strength and solidarity, what are other ways we can show our support? The second Tuesday of each month is our monthly membership meeting held at the Freeport Public Library at 4:30 p.m. (except for the month of December where we will meet at one of the elementary schools).

Why are coming to these meetings important? You will meet and get to know fellow union brothers and sisters from other schools. You will also get up to date information on what is going

on with the Grievance and Negotiating, Insurance, and Classified Advisory Committees. Plus you will get a chance to speak about issues or concerns you have at your school and you will hear concerns others have at their schools. It is a chance to come together, support one another, and show solidarity.

A big concern is that schools are short staffed when it comes to paraeducators. Part of the problem for the lack of paras is the cost it takes to become one. If someone does not have an associate's degree they must take the ParaPro test at the cost of \$65.00, a \$100 application fee (paid once passing the test) and a \$60 registration fee (paid once license has been issued.) If you know someone who would make a great paraeducator but can't afford these costs, have them contact HR. There are area churches in Freeport that are willing to cover the cost of the license and ParaPro test for qualifying candidates. We are working on alternative options but right now this is our best bet.

When working in an understaffed school or classroom, it is important to remember that kindness is

the key. Go the extra mile to help the kids. But also know your rights as a worker. Take your scheduled breaks, keep to your set hours, and know that any changes in your job are to be given to you by your supervisor only. In each school the District sees everyone EQUAL with one supervisor, the Principal. If you have questions about anything you have been asked to do, contact me or a member of the GNC. Let's work as a team to support one another, build each other up, and help to make FSD a place where we all can be proud to be a part of.

THE MORE YOU KNOW . . .

Article III on page 11 in our contract talks about seniority. Each job for classified staff is listed under the letters A-G on this page. However, this page tells us more than seniority. For example: Say I am a Resource Room Paraeducator and in classification "A" and my supervisor, the building Principal, asks me to sub as a Specialized Paraeducator. Can your building Principal ask you to do this? The answer is no. But why? It is a violation of our contract because a Resource Room Paraeducator has a classification of "A." and a Specialized Paraeducator has a classification of "C." To ask you to do a job in a different classification is called "Cross Classification" and a violation of our contract.

Another example of Cross Classification would be an Assistant Cook being asked to do the duties of a Cook in food service. If this is happening to you, let us know immediately.

Pumpkin Chocolate Chip Cookies

1 cup butter

3/4 cup brown sugar

3/4 cup granulated sugar

1 egg

1 tsp cinnamon

1 tsp vanilla

1 tsp baking soda

2 cups flour

1 cup oats

1 cup canned pumpkin

1 package chocolate chips

Cream butter and sugars. Beat in egg and vanilla. Combine flour, oats, baking soda, and cinnamon; stir into creamed mixture with pumpkin. Fold in chocolate chips. Bake at 350 for 12-13 minutes on greased baking sheets. **really good!**
