We all know that unions are the principal means for workers to organize and protect their rights on the job. The union contract or "collective"

agreement" establishes the basic terms and safe conditions of work. But our union does so much more than that. The USW union works to pursue strategies and activities that serve the interests of their members and the community. Some of these include engaging in political action when necessary, Employee Resource Groups and numerous community involvement projects.

I believe unions are important because they help set the standards for education, skill levels, wages, safe working conditions, and quality of life for workers. Unions are more important today than they ever were. Workers have less power when they act individually. But by acting together as a group, they can effect real change. Unions are the collective voice of workers. Unions are the workers' watchdogs, using their power to ensure that workers' rights under the law are protected. Our union has worked hard to ensure fairness and equitable treatment without discrimination.

Also, as a union we have realized that long-term profitability leads to a supply of skilled labor and minimizes turnover. The basic reason for this is simple: if unions provide a voice to workers, the number of dissatisfied workers who leave is reduced, and we have less turnover in the hourly ranks.

Belonging to a union gives you rights under the law that you do not have as an individual. Once you have formed a union, your employer must bargain with your union over your wages, benefits, hours and safe working conditions.

For all that you do, I am thankful. The retirement gifts of a watch, jacket and pocketknife are very nice and I will treasure them forever, but the fact that USW local 105 has always been there for me and my co-workers for over 35 years, means a lot to me.



ARCONIC WELLNESS REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM


Do you know that Arconic LIFE Program reimbursement applies to retirees as well as active employees and their dependents?
