### **KNOW YOUR CONTRACT**

Want to know where to locate items in your contract? I posted this previously but here is an updated version for our newest contract. Remember, you can also view our contract on the FSD website under HR if you can't find yours.

Here is a guide to a few important items:

 Page 10 is where to find a list of Bargaining Unit classifications. Each Bargaining Unit employee has seniority

- rights within one of these classifications listed.
- Page 11 explains the bumping process in the event of a Reduction in Force.
- Page 15 explains the way breaks work and the process to sending out the informational letters every summer.
- Page 16 is about our probationary period
- Page 17 explains sick and personal leaves
- Page 24 tells about the AMRP benefit
- Page 25 is about tuition reimbursement
- Page 26 explains your \$15,000 Life Insurance benefit
- Page 26 explains our grievance procedure
- Page 28 talks about the discipline procedure

Plus many other areas, I can't preach enough the importance of getting to know your contract!

# Understanding Your Retirement IMRF Benefits

Pre-Retirement workshops are intended for members within five years of retirement. These web workshops will address the steps you must take before and during the IMRF retirement application process. Workshops for January 2022 are:

-Thursday, January 6<sup>th</sup> 5-6pm -Saturday, January 29<sup>th</sup> 9-10am If you are planning to retire soon this will help you to understand the process you will need to take.

If you are not yet vested, or are vested but not near retirement age, a web workshop of "Understanding Your IMRF Benefits" is encouraged. The next scheduled one that is not in the middle of a school day is Wednesday, April 13, from 5-6pm.

### Mom's Crockpot Ham and Potatoes

10 medium potatoes, about 3 lbs, peeled and thinly sliced

- 3 cups cubed fully cooked ham
- 1 large onion, thinly sliced
- 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- ½ tsp paprika
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1. In a greased slow cooker, layer half of the potatoes, ham, onions and cheese. Repeat layers. Pour soup over top. Sprinkle with paprika and pepper.
- 2. Cover and cook on low 8-10 hours until potatoes are tender.
- 3. Enjoy!
