

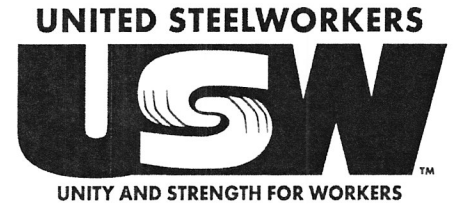

Environmental Efforts/Recycling Continue – NEW YELLOW TUBS

Sometime next week new yellow recycling tubs will be put into service in Sheet Finishing and IPS. These yellow tubs will be for: **Fiber** - cardboard, kraft paper and waxy paper - **Plastics** – Eliite and plastic sheeting – **Wood** – Masonite, boards and planks. The new yellow tubs will be for recyclables only.

The yellow tubs will make it easier to make sure the recyclables get to the proper place in the Foil Mill recycling area and also free up scrap tubs for our mill scrap.

If you have questions or suggestion concerning the use of the yellow tubs please give your feedback to your Safety Star Point or Team Coach so that they can get the information to Isabella Ekedede the environmental intern currently deploying this project. The plan is to use these tubs across the plant in the near future.

Sheet Finishing Department Reduction

On Monday June 19th the company announced to the Union Leadership that they needed to reduce the number of employees in the Sheet Finishing Department by 18 due to reduced orders in the heat treats.

These will be internal reductions. The Plate Mill Department needs 12 employees and Ingot Plant needs 6 employees. A transfer posting was put up on Tuesday June 20th to fill the needs in the Plate Mill and Ingot Plant. The transfer posting will come down on **Friday June 30th @9:00 AM**. After the transfer needs are filled, the employees being reduced from Sheet Finishing will back fill the openings created by the transfers.

The reductions will be done following **Article IX – Reduction of Forces** using company seniority. When the Sheet Finishing Department has a need for employees those that were laid off out of the department under Article IX will have restoration rights back to the department following **Article XI – Restoration of Forces**.

FUTURE WASTE BINS

The new yellow bins will be placed in the same spot as the old ones, but the number of bins each PC will have will vary depending on the waste it produces. The most a PC will have is three, plus one for dunnage. The bins will be separated by:

- Fiber: cardboard Kraft paper, waxy paper
- Plastics: Elite, plastic sheeting
- Wood: Masonite, boards, planks

Each bin will be labeled to show where the waste came from.

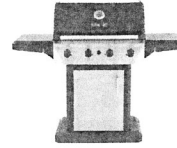

Congress Shouldn't Strip HEALTH CARE COVERAGE From Working People



Virtually everything working people have gained to improve health and retirement security since the 1940s is now at risk, including Medicare, Medicaid, workplace health plans, the Affordable Care Act and Social Security.

Republicans in Congress are rushing to approve legislation that effectively would end these health programs as we know them and not provide a replacement for the 30 million Americans who will become uninsured just from repealing the Affordable Care Act.
