July 11, 2017

1:30 p.m.

President Jerry Redington called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The roll call of officers was taken and all were present. The minutes for the June meeting were read and approved.

The Treasurer's report was given and approved.

It was also noted that it is less expensive to have it at the hall than at Jane Addams and having it on a meeting day means more people can make it. A motion was made and passed that we hold the next picnic at the hall on June 12, 2018, our regular meeting date.
